NOTE: The equipment listed below is intended for use by personnel with certified training in technical large animal emergency rescue. Use of this equipment without adequate training can result in serious injury or death. **This is for the OPERATIONS level course.**

**Personal Gear Recommendations For ALL Participants**

**WEAR FOR THE COURSE (REQUIRED):**

- Gloves
- Boots (with or without steel toe)
- Protective headwear (helmet with chinstrap; firefighter or OSHA approved is preferred)

**IN THEIR KIT BAG (Recommendations):**

- Jacket or Vest (Brightly colored and Reflective)
- Goggles
- Knife or Leatherman type multi-tool
- Ear protection
- Urban Type uniform (T-shirt, BDU pants, boots) with logo to identify yourself
- Primary and Secondary ID Badge / Card

**TLAER Rescue Equipment Requirements for an OPERATIONS Course**

Our philosophy is that if you do not have the equipment and gear that you need to form a Large Animal Rescue team, that you are wasting your time hosting a course because when it is over, you will not have what you need to perform rescues and get others involved.
