Wildfire Response & Recovery Update

September 14, 2020

The Oregon Office of Emergency Management, in coordination with the Oregon Department of Forestry, Oregon State Fire Marshal, Oregon State Police and other state and federal partners, will distribute this daily update, collating verified information on the wildfire response.

## SITUATION SUMMARY

Fire crews continue to focus on protection of life and property. Evacuation orders continue to change as fire activity and containment levels change; check [wildfire.oregon.gov](http://wildfire.oregon.gov) for the latest maps and evacuation levels. Air quality remains at hazardous levels down the Interstate 5 corridor and the Columbia Gorge. Red Flag Warnings for high winds remain in effect in parts of Jackson, Lake and Klamath Counties.
