Reward Still Offered to Solve the 2018 Murder of Cody Oller

PORTLAND, Ore. – Today, the Multnomah County District Attorney’s Office and the Portland Police Bureau are asking the public for information to help solve the murder of Cody Oller.

“Cody was just 25 years old. He moved here from Kansas to live with his sister. He worked at a hotel in downtown. His life here in Portland was just beginning. He had a job and strong family support. We believe there are people either in Portland, Kansas or Missouri who have information about Cody’s death. If that’s you, please come forward,” said Multnomah County District Attorney Mike Schmidt.

This investigation started on January 8, 2018 when officers assigned to the Portland Police Bureau’s North Precinct responded to a report of gunfire at Fernhill Park, located in the 6000 block of Northeast 37th Avenue.

Officers arrived in the area and located Cody lying on the ground inside the park.

Responding emergency medical personnel determined that Cody was deceased. The Oregon State Medical Examiner later determined that Cody’s death was the result of a gunshot wound and ruled the death a homicide.

Despite the ongoing investigative follow up being conducted on this case, there is no suspect information.

Oller's family has pledged a reward of \$20,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for Oller's death.
