Update: 15-Year-Old Shooting Suspect Arrested in Vancouver

May 17, 2018 – The suspect in Friday’s shooting in the Sexton Mountain neighborhood was arrested yesterday afternoon in Vancouver, Washington.

During the investigation, Sheriff’s Office Violent Crimes Unit detectives identified the shooting suspect as 15-year-old Raelyn G. Domingo of Vancouver.

Detectives learned she was the suspect in an unrelated robbery reported early Saturday morning in Camas, Washington. Working closely with Camas Police investigators, corroborating information linked Ms. Domingo to the Washington County shooting.



Yesterday afternoon, at 5:29 p.m., Ms. Domingo was taken into custody in the Mill Plain community of Vancouver by members of the U.S. Marshals Service Fugitive Task Force, Camas and Vancouver Police Departments, and Clark County Sheriff’s Office.

Ms. Domingo is being held at the Clark County Juvenile Justice Center on a Washington County arrest warrant for robbery in the first degree and assault in the first degree, both Measure 11 charges. Additionally, Camas Police investigators have charged Ms. Domingo with first-degree robbery. Oregon will seek her extradition from Washington.

Sheriff’s Office detectives were assisted in their investigation by detectives from the Tigard Police Department.

On May 11, 2018, at 1:51 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a shooting at a residence in the 8600 block of Southwest Muledeer Drive in the Sexton Mountain community.

Upon arrival, deputies found a 56-year-old male suffering from an apparent gunshot wound. He was able to provide a description of a female suspect prior to being transported to a local hospital by with apparent non-life-threatening injuries.

Three separate K-9 units, two from the Sheriff's Office and one from Sherwood Police, searched the area extensively but the suspect was not located. Members of the inter-agency Tactical Negotiations Team assisted in the search. Area schools were placed in lockout for a short period of time.

The suspect is described as an Asian female, approximately 20-years-old, with long dark hair.

Members from the Sheriff's Office Violent Crimes Unit responded and are investigating. They are being assisted at the crime scene by Forensic Science Unit personnel.
