**Charges filed in alleged assault and robbery of bicyclist along the Springwater Corridor**

Today, Multnomah County District Attorney Rod Underhill announced that 20-year-old Diovionne Green was charged for allegedly assaulting and robbing a bicyclist along the Springwater Corridor in Portland, Oregon.

This investigation started when the victim reported that he was assaulted and that his bicycle was stolen during the same criminal episode, according to court documents. The bike that was stolen was reported to be extremely rare and had a value of more than \$10,000.

After the alleged robbery, the victim told law enforcement that he received a video depicting an adult male riding his stolen bike, according to court documents. The video was sent to the victim from another person using a social media application.

The video was later shared with several media outlets, according to court documents. During the investigation, a person contacted law enforcement and provided information that resulted in the identification of Green.

On August 29, 2019, Green met with detectives assigned to the Portland Police Bureau's Robbery Detail and was subsequently booked into the Multnomah County Detention Center.

Upon preliminary review of the case, the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office filed a charging document that alleges one count of robbery in the third degree, one count of assault in the fourth degree and one count of theft in the first degree.

According to court documents, when interviewed by detectives, Green admitted that he stole the victim's bike and that he took it to his mother's house. The Multnomah County District Attorney's Office was informed by law enforcement that the victim's bicycle was recovered and returned to him.

At this point, no additional information can be released because of the ongoing investigation.

A charging document is only an accusation of a crime. Green is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.
