Detectives Identify and Arrest Suspect in Convenience Store Robbery

June 30, 2021

On May 19, 2021, at 12:28 a.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to an armed robbery call at the 7-Eleven store near the intersection of SW Beaverton Hillsdale Highway and SW 91st Avenue. This area is in the [Enhanced Sheriff's Patrol District](#) (ESPD). The suspect, described as a white male wearing a full-face ski mask, all black clothing, with black fingerless gloves, pointed a handgun at the cashier's head and demanded money from the cash register.

The suspect grabbed a handful of cigars and placed them along with cash into a black reusable grocery-style bag that they brought with them and left the store on foot.

A subsequent search by deputies did not locate the suspect.

In June, detectives found evidence linking Jarrod Deferrari, age 24, to the robbery of the 7-Eleven in an abandoned home on SW Beaverton Hillsdale Highway where Deferrari had previously been trespassing. Social media posts by Deferrari also appeared to link him to the robbery.

On Monday, June 28, 2021, detectives with the Violent Crimes Unit arrested Deferrari on charges of robbery in the first degree, unlawful use of a weapon, and menacing.

Deferrari was already in custody at the Washington County Jail related to previous charges of burglary in the first degree, possession of burglary tools, interfering with a peace officer, contempt of court, and criminal mischief in the second degree.
