Alternative Youth Activities to support interventions for 5th-9th grade students that increase high school graduation rates, 2022-23	Coos Bay	\$38,500	Alternative Youth Activities will conduct street outreach and engagement activities in Coos and Curry counties, to bring disengaged rural students back into education and supportive services. They employ successful youth graduates of their programs as mentors, providing peer-to-peer coaching for academic and career case management for youth who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Collaboration is a priority for student success, to reduce duplication of services, and to build on the strengths of partners such as the community action agency, and community college.
Boys & Girls Club of Southwestern Oregon to support interventions for 5th-9th grade students that increase high school graduation rates, 2022-23	Coos Bay	\$45,000	Boys & Girls Club of Southwestern Oregon will re-engage youth in Coos County and offer learning experiences for 5-9th graders to plan for their future, adopt healthy lifestyles and give back to their communities. About 89% of the program's participants receive need-based scholarships to participate and Coos County is entirely rural. Through Project Learn, club activities will support social-emotional development and high school graduation. Parents frequently share report cards with the club staff so that parents and staff can collaborate on academic success. The Club's local partners include the cities and school districts of Coos Bay and North Bend and local tribes.
