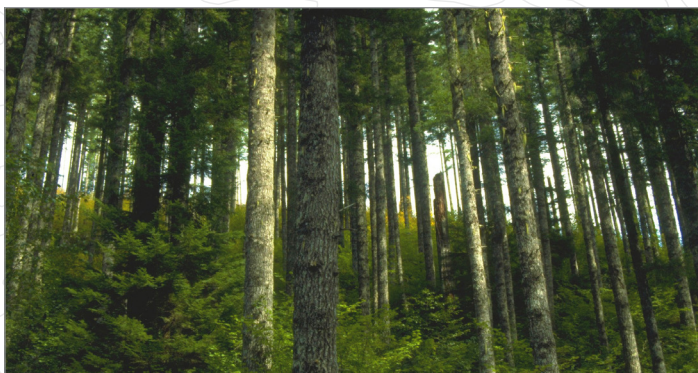

The Bureau of Land Management is infusing \$161 million for ecosystem restoration and resilience on the nation's public lands, as part of the Biden-Harris Administration's Investing in America agenda. The proposed work will focus on 21 "Restoration Landscapes" across 11 western states, restoring public lands, strengthening communities and local economies, advancing climate resilience and furthering our commitment to Tribal collaboration and partnership.

Like many forest watersheds, over time the timberland of the southwest has been greatly simplified and stream channels degraded, with fish and other aquatic life declining as a result. Restoration here will focus on the threatened Oregon Coast coho salmon, using aquatic and upland restoration projects also supporting the recovery of other fish, amphibians, birds, and plants. Projects will build wildland urban interface forest resilience.

This effort will complement \$5.03 million of funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

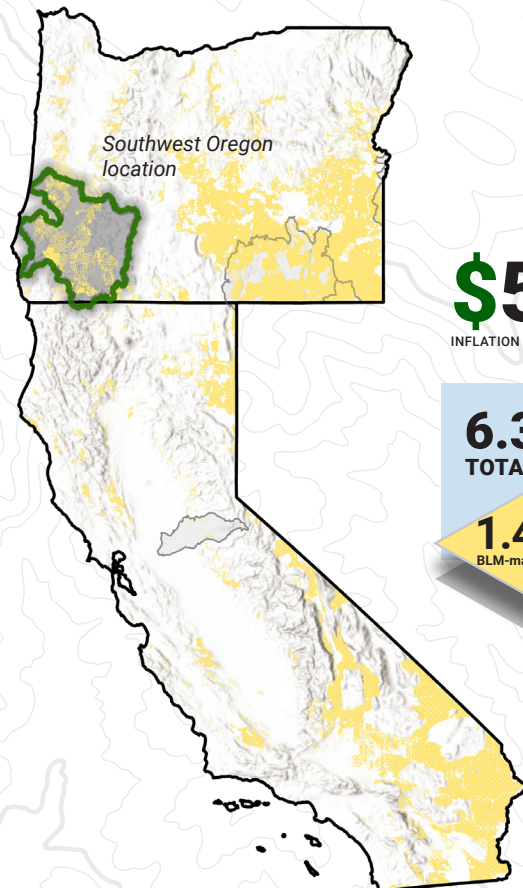

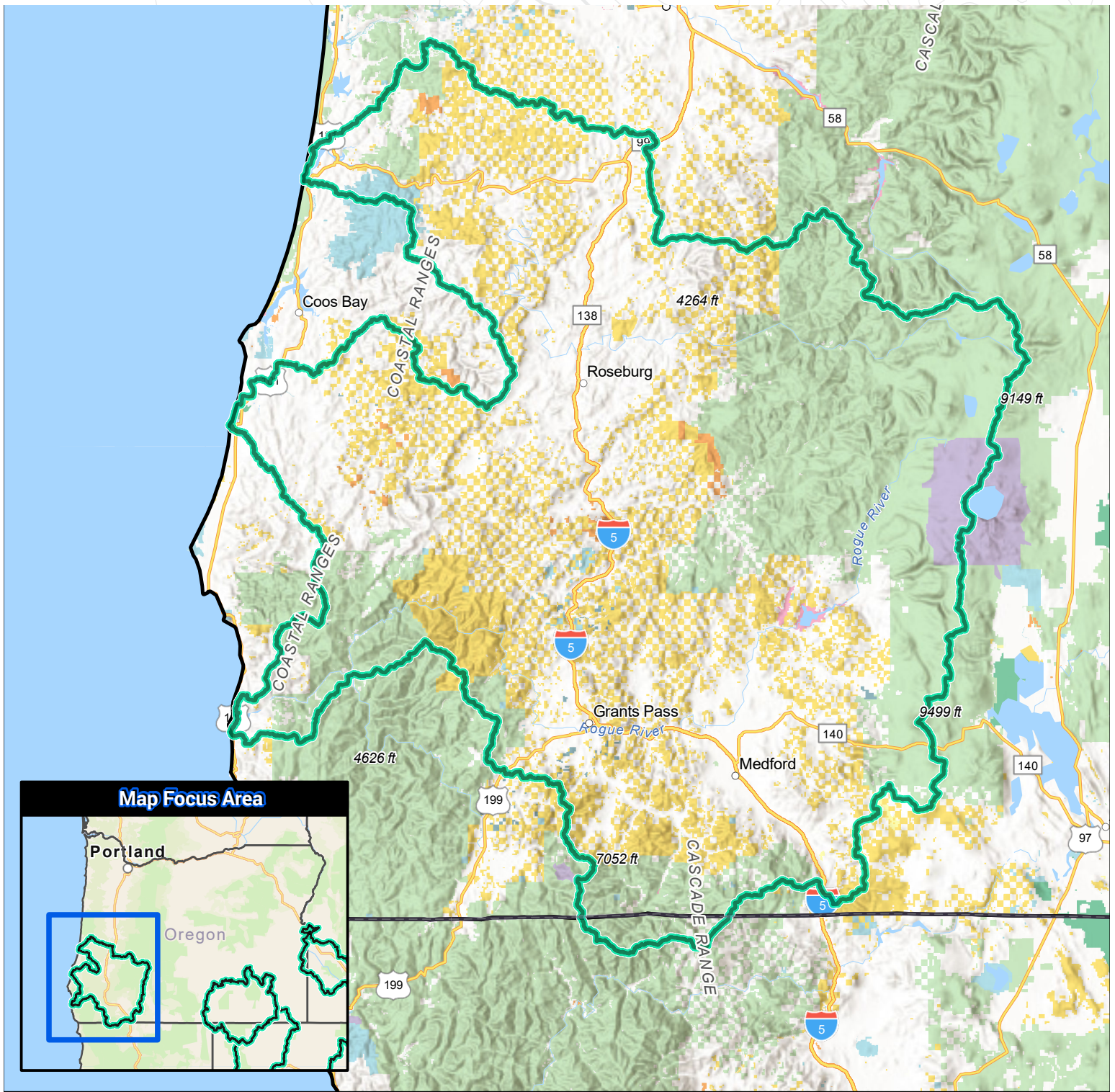
